Objectives

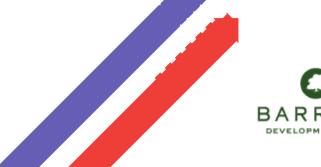

Policy

The Group will

- Comply with ecological legislation, national planning policy and apply best practice to protect and enhance the environment we operate in.
- Identify and manage ecological aspects of our developments from the time of land purchase through development and handover to the communities we create.
- Ensure that developments where we seek planning permission, develop and implement a Biodiversity Action Plan.
- Ensure all our operating Divisions follow our Group standards contained in our Great Places design guide, Ecological Practice Notes and landscape design guide 'Growing with Nature'.
- Work with and support organisations that specialise in ecology to help further our approach to managing and enhancing natural capital.
